**NOTE: Well known references, such as *World Book* or *Encyclopedia Britannica*, are usually not noted in bibliographies/works cited. Other books are cited as shown below:**

#### ***Book by a single author:***

Franklin, John Hope. *George Washington Williams: A Biography*. Chicago: University of Chicago Press, 1985.

#### ***Book by two or three authors:***

Lynd, Robert, and Helen Lynd. *Middletown: A Study in American Culture*. New York: Harcourt, Brace and World, 1929.

#### ***Book by more than three authors:***

Greenberger, Martin, Julius Aronofsky, James L. McKenney, and William F. Massy.  
*Networks for Research and Education: Sharing of Computer and Information Resources Nationwide*. Cambridge: MIT Press, 1974.

#### ***Editor(s) or compiler(s) as "Author" of a book:***

von Hallberg, Robert, ed. *Canons*. Chicago: University of Chicago Press, 1984.

Elliott, Elizabeth, and John MacMaster, eds. *Reflections on the Novel "Granby"*. Columbia, S.C.: University of South Carolina Press, 1992.

#### ***No author given for a work:***

*The Lottery*. London: J. Watts, 1732.

***Institution, corporation, or association as the "author" :***

American Library Association, Young Adult Services Division. Services Statement Development Committee. *Directions for Library Service to Young Adults*. Chicago: American Library Association, 1978.

***A component work by an author (or authors) in a book by another author(s) or editor(s) -- such as, an article in an anthology or an article or essay in a book of essays :***

Beech, Mary Higdon. "The Domestic Realm in the Lives of Hindu Women in Calcutta."  
In *Separate Worlds : Studies of Purdah in South Asia*, eds. Hanna Papnanek and Gail Minault, 110-38. Delhi: Chanakya, 1982.

***A component work from one volume of a series in which all volumes in the series have the same title:***

***Book in a series, in which the book cited has its own title, as well as having the series title:***

***NOTE: The series editor(s), if there is a series editor, is noted after the series title. The number and/or volume of the book being cited should also be included -- if there is a number and/or volume.***

## ARTICLES

***Article in a journal (scholastic periodical) :***

***NOTE: The number listed directly after the italicized journal title is the volume number of the journal used.***

Jackson, Richard. "Running Down the Up-Escalator; Regional Inequality in Papua New Guinea."  
*Australian Geographer* 14 (May 1979) : 25, 175-84.

Smith, Lawrence P. "Sailing Close to the Wind." *Politics in Action* 10, no. 4 (1993) : 80-102.

***Article in a magazine (non-scholastic periodical):***

***NOTE: Only the date is included (Sept. 24, 1986 in the example); not the volume number***

Savalis, Telly. "Crime Story." *Variety*, 24 September 1986, 74-75.

### **Article in a newspaper:**

**NOTE: Newspaper articles are not usually put into works cited/bibliographies, unless issues covering a period of time have been used or an article is cited more than once in the research work. In these cases, cite as shown below:**

*New York Times*. 5 January-10 July 1950.
